Artist Gabrielle Bates admits her latest art show has Snugglepot and Cuddlepie going feral.

She has reset the charming gumnuts and blossoms of Gibb's illustrations with images of "bogans, emoteens, rednecks, Bra Boys and ferals".

visited Gibbs' historic home Nutcote at Neutral Bay. Gibbs, who died in 1969, was famous for her cartoons, illustrations and books including the Adventures of Snugglepot and Cuddlepie.

Nutcote manager Courtney Eckler said she wouldn't comment on the artwork until she'd seen it but said a group of Nutcote guides was organising an outing to the exhibition.
